NOTIFICATION/DIRECTIVES

All concerned are hereby notified that Chaibasa Engineering College is steadfast in its commitment to maintaining a ragging-free campus. Recent reports and complaints, including one escalated to the Anti-Ragging Helpline in New Delhi, indicate a rise in ragging incidents. In response, the institute issues the following directives to all students, applicable both on and off campus:

1. All students, especially hostel residents, must familiarize themselves with the definition and types of ragging as outlined in the UGC guidelines (enclosed). Understanding what constitutes ragging is mandatory.
2. Senior Students have no official authority to call/instruct junior Students on any matter(Except when they are asked by competent authority of Institute or Medical & other emergencies).
3. Senior students(2ND& 3RD Year) are strictly prohibited from engaging junior students in any activity within the hostel or campus without explicit permission from the competent authority. Violations may result in disciplinary action. Any potential activity must be reported immediately to the Anti-Ragging Squad, Hostel Warden, or Dean of Student Welfare to avoid penalties.
4. Unofficial gatherings in hostels without explicit permission or an official purpose are strictly prohibited. Organizers and participants of such gatherings will face disciplinary action.
5. To raise awareness about the impact, consequences, and penalties of ragging, posters will be displayed across the campus. Damaging these institutional assets will result in disciplinary action.
6. Junior students (Currently 1st Year Students) are strictly advised to report Institute authority, appropriate forum about any potential ragging attempt by senior students. If any junior student help senior students in abetment of ragging/assisting ragging in any form may face strict disciplinary punishment.
7. Any ragging complaint received will be thoroughly investigated by the Anti-Ragging Committee in accordance with the UGC guidelines and the *Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions (Third Amendment), Regulations, 2016*. Attempts to influence or pressurize the committee or its enquiry process will be treated as acts of indiscipline.

Enclosure 1

PUNISHMENT PROVISIONS IN RAGGING CASE AS PER UCG, AICTE GUIDELINES GOVT. OF INDIA

Any student or group of students found guilty of ragging on or off campus shall be liable to one or more of the following punishments:

1. Debarring from appearing in any sessional test/university examination or withholding results.
2. Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
3. Withdrawing scholarships and other benefits.
4. Suspension from the college for a period of one month.
5. Cancellation of admission.
6. Debarring from representing the institution in any national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
7. Suspension/expulsion from the hostel.
8. Rustication from the institution for periods varying from 1 to 4 semesters or equivalent period.
9. Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution.
10. Fine up to twenty-five thousand rupees.
11. **Imprisonment for a term which may extend to two years or with fine which may extend to ten thousand rupees or with both.**
12. Collective punishment - When the students committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment as a deterrent to ensure community pressure on the potential raggers.

Note: Any institution that fails to take adequate steps to prevent ragging, or fails to act in accordance with the Regulations, or fails to punish perpetrators of ragging suitably, is liable to penalties and punishments as per the provisions of the Regulations.



Enclosure 2

What Constitutes Ragging?

Ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts:

1. Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student.
2. Indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student.
3. Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student.
4. Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher.
5. Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
6. Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students
7. Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
8. Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student.
9. Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher.
